VCE Physics Day

Six weeks into the school year and it was off to Melbourne to participate in the annual VCE Physics day at Luna Park. It was an early start and we were greeted with a nice clear sunny day, rather than the smoke haze from the fires earlier in the week. Our teacher Mr. Mueller and parent Ms. Pickett skilfully made it through Melbourne peak hour traffic to be at Luna Park well before the 10 am start. Already students from a large number of suburban and regional schools had gathered outside. Without much delay we entered and after a welcome and safety instructions by the Luna Park staff it was onto the Roadrunner for the first ride of the day. Fairly tame compared to what was to come later, but a good way to start. On each of the 3 Physics days, for 4 hours, approximately 800 students would rotate through all the rides. As well as enjoying the rides, there were worksheets or tasks to be completed, where students investigated the physics involved. Often this involved taking videos of the rides and using accelerometers to determine accelerations so forces acting could be calculated. The different rides open to the physics students on the day included Twin Dragons, Spider, Carousel, Ferris wheel, Enterprise, Top Drop, Pharaoh's Curse, Ghost Train, Dodgem Cars and the Silly Serpent. The last ride of the day was the famous Scenic Railway rollercoaster which also had the longest queue. After taking the group photo in front the Luna Park mouth we had half an hour to get to Monash University.

Traffic was heavy and we arrived a little late at Robert Blackwood Hall where we were met by two Access Monash students who led us to the Menzies Building for an information session about university life. Students were told about the various options for courses, as well as ways to gain entry and financial assistance. It was a normal university day and our students were able to get a good idea of how busy it was and to see some of surroundings during our whirlwind tour of the campus. After thanking our hosts and tour guides, it was off to our next stop, over the road to the Australian Synchrotron.

After signing in and getting visitor badges we joined other school groups to start the tour. Over the scale model of the Synchrotron the tour leader explained its operation. Then it was off to see it in action, not really much to see as the electron beam was fully enclosed but a massive building with a lot of equipment and computers.

We learnt that the intense light beam produced by accelerating electrons is used in different branches of science to help discover new things to benefit us. We found out that they were using light diffraction to produce an x-ray image that makes it easier to distinguish between bones and the different types of muscle tissue than with current x-rays. Soon the tour was over and after signing out we were heading back home. Of course, by now hunger pains had set in requiring a tea stop at Officer. There KFC and Mc Donald's did a roaring trade filling the almost insatiable appetites of the students. Even though it had been a long day filled with the three activities, there was unanimous agreement that it had been an enjoyable and educational day.











China Information and Expression of Interest 2019

Dear Students

It is with much pleasure that I am announcing that students in years 7 – 11 will have the opportunity to participate in the China Sister School excursion that will be happening in September 2019.

Please note, this will be a reciprocal arrangement and students from our sister school will be visiting Australia in June/July for a homestay of approximately 3 – 4 days.

Please find below the information regarding the Victorian Sister Schools to China in September 2019. This is being organised through Jiangsu-Victoria International Education Centre (JESIE)

- 1. There are two options for the school to choose from.
- 2. JESIE will provide funding support to partly cover the full cost. Each participant will only pay for

Option 1 (Beijing - Nanjing - Sister School - Shanghai): AUD \$2,000 as a package including international airfares and in-country costs (for accommodation, meals, transportation and tours in Beijing, Nanjing and Shanghai as per the draft itinerary, as well as the sister school visit with homestay). *The travelling dates will be between 14th September - 28th September.*

Option 2 (Beijing - Xi'an - Nanjing - Sister School - Shanghai): AUD \$2,500 as a package including international airfares and incountry costs (for accommodation, meals, transportation and tours in Beijing, Xi'an, Nanjing and Shanghai as per the draft itinerary, as well as the sister school visit with homestay). *The travelling dates will be between 12th September - 28th September.*

- 3. The cost for accompanying teachers are the same as for students (i.e. AUD \$2,000 per teacher for Option 1, and AUD \$2,500 per teacher for Option 2). If anyone would prefer hotel instead of homestay during the school visit, the extra cost will be AUD \$250 per person.
- 4. Students and teachers will need to cover own costs for passport, visa and insurance. The insurance can be organized by individuals/parents or through the Department of Education.
- 5. The JESIE team will assist in organising the whole trip, including the air-tickets, in-county tours as listed, and the sister school visit. For the international flights, two airlines will be considered Singapore Airlines and Cathay Pacific Airlines.
- 6. Both students and teachers will be staying in hotels during the tours as indicated. Teachers will have single rooms while students will have twin rooms.
- 7. There are no minimum numbers required. The maximum numbers for each school will be 16 students and 3 teachers.
- 8. Victorian secondary schools will travel together and will attend the Welcome Ceremony in Nanjing before travelling to respective sister schools.

9. Timeline

Expression of Interest application needs to be completed and returned to the school by Friday 26th **April.** Interviews to select applicants will be held the following week.

Parents will need to provide a copy of their child's birth certificate, and a copy of their child's passport.

Please make sure each passport has at least six months of validity before travelling from and then re-entering Australia.

Full payment will be due by 30 June

Individual schools can collect the money and make full payment to JESIE by the due date.

Visa applications will be submitted in August

Detailed arrangements will be advised late on.

Girl Power in Engineering & IT

The University of Melbourne's **Girl Power in Engineering & IT** program is back for 2019 and we're once again calling for applications from female year 9 students who may be considering a career in Engineering and IT.

About the program

Now in its fourth year, Girl Power in STEM gives female students insight into the world of STEM while inspiring them about the possibilities of a career in the industry. The program runs over four years and includes a three-night camp at the University of Melbourne in year 9, work experience in year 10 (20-24 June 2020) and a mentoring program in year 11 and 12.

Beginning with the camp in year 9, participants will have the opportunity to explore several different areas of engineering during campus tours, group projects and presentations by students, faculty and professional engineers. In 2019, the camp will run Sunday 7 – Wednesday 10 July and is free for students to attend.

How to apply - Applications open at 9am on Monday 1 April on our web site

Students wishing to apply are required to complete an online application addressing the below selection criteria.

Selection Criteria

Essential

- 1. A keen interest in maths and science with a desire to explore engineering or IT as a career
- 2. Well-developed communication and relationship building skills which will enable you to act as an ambassador for STEM and for the Girl Power program at your School (if selected, the student will be asked to demonstrate evidence of their initiative to the University)
- 3. Strong critical thinking skills, with an ability to see and describe the importance of science, technology, engineering and mathematics to society
- 4. Demonstrated experience working collaboratively as part of a team
- 5. Ability to work off your own initiative and be self-motivated and driven

Desired

- 1. Ability to demonstrate a broad range of interests and involvement in extracurricular activities
- 2. Proven leadership skills
- 3. Being part of an established network (ie. school clubs, teams) that you are willing to share ideas with
