School council elections for the MNSC council will open on Friday 1st March. Information about the role of school council and the nomination process is included in the newsletter. Parents are the key people on school council and assist in setting the strategic direction of the school and they have a role in governance. Please consider applying to be a council member. Council meets twice per term.

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School Council Elections

Information regarding the forthcoming school council elections is included in this newsletter. Please give some thought to nominating. Information about the role of school councillors and in fact council is included to assist you. Of course if you have any questions feel free to contact me at the school.

Nominations for the 2019 Mirboo North Secondary College school council elections will open on Friday 1st March and close on Friday 8th March.

Attached to the newsletter are self-nomination forms that need to be completed and dropped off at the office by the closing date.

An election will be held only if the number of nominations is greater than the number of vacancies.

General information about School Councils

School councils can have up to three categories of membership:

1. Parent members – elected by the school parent community. This is a mandated category.
2. DET employee members – elected by the DET employees; the principal is included as a DET employee member and has full voting rights. This is a mandated category.
3. Community members – this is optional category. These positions are *co-opted* by the school council rather than elected. These members have the same voting rights as elected members. Schools can choose to have this optional category.
4. Student members—2 students will be elected during Term 1. This is a mandated category.

Co-opting community members allows school councils to bring additional skills and perspectives to the council that may not be available from the parent or teaching community.

More than one third of school council members **must** be parents.

Office Bearers

Mandated Position:

President – Parent member (non DET employee), or community member who is chairperson of school council meetings.

Executive officer – the principal.

Other positions may include:

Vice president - Parent member (non DET employee) or community member, who chairs school council meetings in the absence of the president.

Terms of Office

School councillors are elected for **two year** terms.

The term of office and rights and responsibilities of community (ie: co-opted) members are the same as those of elected school councillors.

Half the school council members retire each year but can stand for re-election.

The position of minute secretary can be filled by a non-council member. If this is the case, that person is required to be a silent observer and has no voting rights. Alternatively, the position of minute secretary can be filled by a school council member.

School Council Elections 2019

Elections for State School Councils are held at this time each year. School Council are made up of three groups of people:

- Parent Representatives
- Department of Education and Training (DET) representatives
- Community Members (this includes our college captains)
- 2 Student members

This year there are **4 Parent Representatives** vacancies and **1 Department of Education** representative vacancies.

Nominations for these vacancies are now open. Nominations are to be submitted at the school office by 4pm on **FRIDAY 8th March**. For your information, I have included information on School Council and a nomination form.

Please consider nominating for Council. We need your support and welcome your input.

School Council Elections 2019

What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally formed bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within centrally provided guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Who is on the school council?

There are three possible categories of membership:

A mandated elected Parent category. More than one third of the total members must be from this category. Department of Education and Training (DET) employees can be Parent members at their child's school.

A mandated elected DET employee category. Members of this category may make up no more than one third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.

An optional Community member category. Its members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. DET employees are not eligible to be Community members.

The term of office for members is two years. Half the members must retire each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

Why is Parent membership so important?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying in itself and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

How can you become involved?

The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held in February or March each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

In view of this, you might seriously consider:

- Standing for election as a member of the school council
- Encouraging another person to stand for election.

Do I need special experience to be on school council?

No. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

What do you need to do to stand for election?

The principal will issue a notice and call for nominations following the commencement of term 1 each year. All school council elections must be completed by the end of March.

If you decide to stand for election, you will need to arrange for someone to nominate and second you as a candidate in either the Parent category or DET employee category. A nomination form is attached to this newsletter. Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the notice of election.

If there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, a ballot will be conducted within the 7 days after the call for nominations has closed.

Remember

- ➔ Ask at the school for help if you would like to stand for election and are not sure what to do.
- ➔ Consider standing for election to council this year.
- ➔ Be sure to vote in the elections.

House Swimming Report


