Parent Opinion Survey

WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies

Approximately 30 per cent of parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 22**rd **July** to **Sunday 11**th **August**.

Invitations will be emailed to randomly selected families by Wednesday 24th July.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **10-15 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.


The survey results will be reported back to the school at the end of September. Please contact Rebecca Woodall if you would like more information.

LA TROBE, SOUTH GIPPSLAND AND VSA JUNIOR GLIDING SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME

The Gliding Federation of Australia Inc (GFA) is the national body regulating the sport of gliding and soaring in Australia. Its mission is "to drive the development and promotion of the sport of gliding and foster excellence in safe, accessible and enjoyable soaring".

The South Gippsland Gliding Club has a 50 year history of gliding and in its time has trained many pilots who have gone on to enjoy the thrill of gliding in particular and aviation as a profession. The La Trobe Valley Gliding Club was established in the same period and flew from the La Trobe Valley Airfield. This Club has now ceased operations and has dedicated its remaining funds to South Gippsland on the proviso that the money be used for *ab initio* gliding training. An annual gliding scholarship aimed at encouraging new people into the sport of gliding by providing scholarship holders with low cost *ab-initio* gliding training. The La Trobe and South Gippsland Scholarship is administered by the South Gippsland Gliding Club and will be awarded to suitable applicants.

In partnership with Victorian Soaring Association (VSA) the aim of this scholarship is to encourage young people to take up gliding. Applicants must have had no previous hands on flying training. The funding from VSA is on the proviso of a commitment from the successful applicants as shown below in Conditions 6 and 8.

The value of this scholarship for 2019/20 is up to \$1500, for gliding training costs. The scholarship does not include GFA or South Gippsland Club membership costs. Detailed scholarship conditions and application process are summarised below.

Applications are now sought for the 2019/20 Gliding Scholarship, for the period December 2019 to 30th June 2020. Newsletter article: Bushfire At-Risk Register - Schools

Here is an article for you to publish in your newsletter or on your website. It will help you communicate to parents that your school is listed on the Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) and prepared should a Code Red day be determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner.

When using the article, you are advised to:

- review the text for relevance to the specific circumstance noting that red text indicates statements
 that are notined as that must be existent for each use.
- that are optional or that must be reviewed for each use

 copy the required text onto your school's website or into the newsletter

School procedures for the bushfire season

Fire danger ratings and warnings are used in Victoria to provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life.

Schools and children's services listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) will be closed when a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined in their Bureau of Meteorology district. Our school has been identified as being one of those at high bushfire risk and is listed on the BARR.



FIRE DANGER RATING

Where possible, we will provide parents with up to four days notice of a potential Code Red day closure by letter [and SMS message, Facebook, email and Compass push notifications (shows trees). A Code Red day will be determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner no later than 1.00 pm the day before the potential closure. Once we are advised of the confirmation of the Code Red day we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

- No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Code Red day.
- Out-of-school hours care will also be cancelled on these days
- School camps will be cancelled if a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located.
- As a bus co-ordinating school all bus routes will be cancelled.
- A Depending on which Bureau of Mateorology district is impacted bus route cancellations may affect our school

On these Code Red days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – on such days children should never be left at home or in the care of older children.

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Code Red days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Code Red day.

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
