Winter Uniform

Now that the cold weather has started:

REMINDER to Parents/Carers/Students - Years 7-11

- The uniform allows for black pants. Tailored black pants are fine, **but jeans, tracksuit pants compression/skins style pants are not permitted.**
 - If students are cold, then they may wear a white or black t-shirt under their school uniform t-shirt, so long as it is not visible (please avoid patterned/slogan tees when worn under school uniform).
 - We remind parents and students that we have a school windcheater and sweater as part of our uniform, and a black jacket. These are both appropriate to wear as additional layers in cold weather. If a student is STILL cold, then they may also wear a coat over the top of these whilst in the yard at recess and lunch. Our school is adequately heated, so additional layers are not needed in classes.
 - **Students MUST NOT wear non-school uniform hoodies/tops/jumpers/jackets/coats in place of a school windcheater or jacket. If they do, it is likely that it will be confiscated and only returned at the end of the day.**
 - If girls choose to wear the winter skirt they may wear black stockings underneath or plain black leggings with black socks for additional warmth.
- As with the summer uniform, shoes should be black and appropriate for school activities.

School uniform can be purchased from Ridgway Discounts, 73 Ridgeway, Mirboo North and second-hand uniform can be purchased from the Mirboo North Op Shop.

Sth Gippsland Athletics

Another outstanding athletics day for our team. 2nd place overall in the John Trotman Grand Aggregate behind the nearly unbeatable Mary Mac. A moral victory, we are best of the government schools and would have won a third straight year if Mary MacKillop had not joined the competition. Well done Mary Mackillop!

Jasmine Woods clean swept her five events. She broke records by half a metre in her favourite long and triple jumps – despite being rather tired due to a busy schedule. Georgia Martin (U16) was equal champion and has continued her improvement. She had great wins in the 400m and 800m. Tarmah Little, Connor White and Bonnie Waters were runner up age champions and the evergreen Lucinda Graeme 3rd. Emre Cupples was 3rd in the U16 age group – she was picked up to do 800m and 1500m the day before when Jaime Chila withdrew injured, and also filled in when we had an athlete not make it to javelin, discus and shotput – she promptly won two of these events.

Some athletes really went above the call of duty. Luke Stothart filled in everywhere with determination when injury and illness threatened to derail the U17 boys. Tayla Bailey ran herself to exhaustion for 2nd in the 800m. Ella O'Kane filling a couple of events at the last minute. Caitlyn Gill and Audrey Crawford training the house down to throw that little bit further. Audrey made herself available for any relay and ended up running a great leg for the U16 girls – what a team player. Meaghan Stothart working so hard despite having little interest in athletics at the moment. Campbell Pinkerton stepping up to do 400m in the U20 boys at the last minute. Dwayne Perry's amazing effort to finish both first and last in the U20 hurdles (only one competitor!) Mikayla Kunziak being so thrilled to win her 400m. The list goes on.

We had 4 relay wins from 12 – a great strike rate.
