Dear Parent/ Guardian/ Caregiver

Mirboo North Secondary College is looking forward to another positive year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of the school's voluntary financial contributions for 2024.

All students access free education and access to all items and services they need to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements. However, the cost of high quality classes can be higher than the money we receive from the Department of Education, so we ask for optional payments from our school community to support the school and every student

We design our classes to try and meet the wide variety of interests and passions our students have and are committed to high quality learning programs. The optional payments we receive from parents and care givers like you means we can offer the best education and support for our students.

There are two categories you can support the school with optional payments including:

- 1) **Curriculum Contributions-** items that students use to complete their work such as:
 - Art materials
 - Chemicals for use in science
 - Wood, clay, paper, pencils, food ingredients
 - Online learning tools such as Stile, Athletics, Education Perfect and Sparx
- 2) **Other Contributions-** items not directly related to their work such as:
 - Contributions towards general class resources
 - Lockers
 - Student welfare to support our students mental health

Due to the nature of optional payments we will not send an invoice. If you are able to donate, we welcome full or part payments over time that suits your financial needs which can be organised through the school or the Compass portal.

Extra-Curricular Contributions- are on a user-pays basis.

This includes optional Excursions and Camps but also includes classes such as:

- Band
- Music program

Mirboo North Secondary College preferred method of payment is via your Compass Course Confirmations. This is a new option available for families to consider when making parent contributions. FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
